



Oklahoma State University - College of Osteopathic Medicine Terms of Probation

Probationary Restricted Activities

During periods of enrollment and/or while actively remediating a course:

- Students on probation are not permitted to hold or participate in leadership, officer, or organizational roles within student government or student clubs/organizations, including committee assignments or other appointed positions. This restriction applies to all levels, including university, local, state, regional, and national organizations.
- Students on probation are not eligible to run for or be elected to these positions, even if the term of office would begin after their probationary period has ended.
- If a student is placed on probation while already serving in a leadership or organizational role, they must step down for the duration of the probationary period unless an exception is granted by the Dean of the Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine (OSU-COM).
- Students on probation may not participate in the Student Ambassador program or other recruitment activities.
- Students on probation may not participate in research activities, externships or internships, or professional meetings, including any required preparatory or pre-training activities associated with these experiences. The only exception is participation in an externship that is required as part of an approved track (i.e., Rural Medical Track, Tribal Medicine Track, or Urban Underserved Medical Track).
- Students on probation may not enroll in non-mandatory elective courses offered by OSU-COM, with the exception of elective courses required within an approved track (i.e., Rural Medical Track, Tribal Medicine Track, or Urban Underserved Medical Track). Students who are already enrolled in a non-mandatory elective course that is not required as part of a track (i.e., Medical Spanish, American Sign Language, Early Research Experience, Exercise as Medicine, etc.) must withdraw from the course while on probation.
- Students on probation may not participate in university-related travel, whether domestic or international, unless it is required as part of an approved elective track (i.e., Rural Medical Track, Tribal Medicine Track, or Urban Underserved Medical Track). Participation in travel associated with the Global Health Minor is not permitted while on probation.
- Students on probation are not permitted to hold roles as a Research Assistant, Teaching Assistant, or serve as a Supplemental Instruction (SI) leader or tutor.

Probationary Permitted Activities

- Students on probation are expected to participate in all activities that are course requirements, including externships associated with their designated track.
- During periods of enrollment, students may engage in extracurricular activities for a cumulative limit of three (3) hours per week, including:
 - Membership in and attendance at student clubs, organizations, and related events; and
 - Extracurricular activities conducted under the supervision of OSU-COM faculty or staff, including university-sponsored events, wellness activities, fitness classes, and intramural sports.
- During periods of non-enrollment, and when not actively remediating a course, students on probation may participate in university-related activities only with prior approval from the Academic Standards Committee.

I acknowledge that participation in permitted campus life and wellness activities is entirely voluntary. I understand which activities are restricted and which are permitted while on probation and enrolled and/or actively remediating a course. I additionally recognize that participation in campus activities may affect my academic performance and time available to study.

I further acknowledge that participation in restricted activities while on probation will result in the submission of a Non-Cognitive Grade Referral Form, referral to the Academic Standards Committee, and possible disciplinary action. If, after thoroughly reviewing this document, I am uncertain whether a specific activity is permitted, I will submit a request to the Academic Standards Committee to confirm the activity is allowed prior to participation.
